



Interpretive Nature Walk

Where: Garden City Bird Sanctuary

Entrance is across from 181 Tanners Pond Rd. between Somerset Ave. & Merillon/Main Ave.
Park on Tanners Pond Rd.

Join your classmates on Saturday morning for a guided, interpretive nature walk at the Garden City Bird Sanctuary (GCBS). This 7-acre nature refuge was founded in 1995 through the vision of a Garden City community volunteer-led initiative to turn a former storm water management basin (sump) into a green space to serve as a wildlife refuge and provide stewardship and educational opportunities to the community.

The GCBS Board of Directors and Executive Director Patrick DiCaprio have endorsed our use of the Sanctuary and will provide volunteer guides who will tailor the walk to our specifications. If you don't wish to walk for an hour, there are benches throughout the Sanctuary for anyone who wishes to simply sit and enjoy the surroundings, read, or listen to the songs of the many bird species that frequent the area.

The event is free, but donations to support the restoration of the dwindling bee populations at the Sanctuary would be appreciated. If we are able to raise \$500, the Board has offered to recognize the Class of 1968 with a permanent plaque naming our Class and stating the purpose of our contribution.

Registration for a free ticket is necessary for attendance and will help us plan for docents, etc.
